Timothy Mackley indicted for the aggravated murder of Marcine Herinck

Today, Multnomah County District Attorney Rod Underhill announced a grand jury returned a 23 count indictment against 58-year-old Timothy Joseph Mackley for his alleged involvement in the homicide of 89-year-old Marcine Herinck.

The indictment, which was filed on October 3, 2018, charges Mackley with 13 counts of aggravated murder, one count of intentional murder, four counts of burglary in the first degree, two counts of kidnapping in the second degree, two counts of sexual abuse in the first degree and one count of abuse of a corpse.

According to the indictment, on or between September 18 and September 24, 2018, Mackley did unlawfully and intentionally cause the death of Ms. Herinck in the course of, and as a result of, intentional torture and intentional maiming.

Additionally, it is alleged in the indictment that the defendant unlawfully entered Ms. Herinck's residence in the 1500 block of Northeast 150th Avenue in Portland, Oregon on or between September 18 and September 19, 2018 where he kidnapped her and took her from one place to another without consent and with the purpose of terrorizing Ms. Herinck and/or with the purpose of causing physical injury. Furthermore, it is alleged that Mackley sexually abused Ms. Herinck during the six day period when she was missing. Finally, the indictment alleges that upon killing Ms. Herinck, the defendant intentionally removed and transported her remains.

On September 24, 2018, officers performed a traffic stop on a vehicle that was being driven by Mackley in the 9200 block of Southeast Holgate Boulevard. During the investigation, the body of Ms. Herinck was discovered inside the vehicle's trunk, according to information previously released by the Portland Police Bureau. Mackley was taken into custody and booked into the Multnomah County Detention Center. Ms. Herinck was reported missing on September 19, 2018.

Mackley is scheduled to be arraigned on the indictment at 9:30 a.m. on October 4, 2018 at the Multnomah County Justice Center before Judge Angel Lopez. Mackley remains in custody at the Multnomah County Detention Center on a no bail hold.

There is no probable cause affidavit filed in this case. A waiver of probable cause hearing was filed with the court on September 26, 2018 and is available for review using the Oregon eCourt Case Information (OEI) system. The indictment in this matter was filed under case number 18CR64205.

This case is being prosecuted by Senior Deputy District Attorney Amity Girt and Deputy District Attorney Melissa Marrero. No additional comment can be made due to the pending litigation.

An indictment is only an accusation of a crime, and all defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.
